

### Queensland Housing Finance Loan – Regional Trial

The Queensland Government has introduced a two-year trial during which the income eligibility threshold for the Queensland Housing Finance Loan in regional Queensland will increase from \$141,000 to \$201,000 per annum. This will help bridge the gap for regional Queenslanders who struggle to get a home loan because of where they live. Paroo Shire Council Budget 2024/2025

Paroo Shire Council adopted its 2024/25 budget at a Special Meeting on Tuesday 25th June, 2024.

The budget total of operating and capital expenditure for the coming year is \$54M and includes the following items: -

•	TIDS Road Construction	\$2.1M
•	Roads to Recovery	\$1.7M

•	Shire Road Maintenance	\$1M
	RMPC Main Roads Maintenance	\$2M

Council will undertake numerous projects with funding provided by the Federal Government through the LRCI Round 4 program and the State Government's Works for Queensland. New projects include -

- Renewal of the Water Security Monitoring System
- Cemetery Improvements (Cunnamulia & Yowah)
- Footpath Upgrades & Roadworks (town streets)

- Masterplan for the Swimming Pool and Stage 1 Upgrade
- Children's Bicycle Training Track
- Upgrades to Council Houses, Airport Fuel Facility & Wyandra Playground

The budget also provides for carry over projects that were not completed prior to 30th June, 2024. These include Eulo improvement works, the Robber's Tree project and continuation of the Cunnamulla Water Main Replacement

In setting the new budget the Council considered the current cost of living pressures on households as well as the increased cost of Council operations. We were mindful of Council's sustainability and the need to provide the community with a high level of service.

To this end, a 2.5% increase will apply to general rates and the minimum general rate charge. Water charges will remain the same, garbage charges will have a 2.2% increase and a 4.5% increase will apply to sewerage charges.

The 2024/2025 budget for Paroo Shire Council makes provision for extensive works and projects throughout the Shire that will require the employment of local contractors to deliver much of the flood damage repairs to Shire roads in addition to the roadworks that Council employees will undertake.

Councillor's consider the new budget will allow the delivery of improved services to the community as well as providing for the Shire's future.

### Paroo Flood Restoration Project Update from Shepherd - July 2024

SHEPHERD have been continuing the delivery of the January 2022, Rain Event works involving restoration of identified damaged road assets and Council Infrastructure to its original condition. This work is almost complete with only a few treatments left to complete in this package within the Queensland Reconstruction Authority (QRA) delivery time limit.

Multiple betterment site packages have now been completed on Humeburn Road. These constructed betterment sites included stabilised crossings, with two coat bitumen seal treatments which include concrete edge restraints, making the roadway safer and more resilient during future flood events.

The next package of QRA restoration of damages for the September 2022 event has commenced with Council preferred and prequalified contractors being awarded last month.

Delivery of these QRA funded restoration works will commence early July 2024. SHEPHERD Civil Inspectors have commenced site set out of these sites, shire wide in preparation for contractor commencement in coming days.
