LIBRARY UPDATE

STATE AWARD FOR LIBRARY

The Cunnamulla Library has won Library of the Year 2024 for libraries with a population under 35,000. This is the library's 5th QPLA Award since 2013, including the Delegates Award. This year's nomination was about organisations we partner with such as The Indigenous Literacy Foundation, HOPE Project, CACH etc. and all the opportunities partnering with such organisations can bring about. The prize for winning the award is \$1000, which will go towards purchasing something for the community, as well as a framed certificate.

FLOOD RESTORATION PROJECT OCTOBER UPDATE

- SHEPHERD have now completed the January 2022 event delivery with the remaining treatments completed on Linden Nebine Road, Amenda Tinnenburra Road, and Rocky Road now completed back to their former condition. The QRA funded work of new reconstructed roads, drainage, and table drains make the roads safer and more resilient during future rain and flooding events.
- While completing the current delivery of the January 2022 event for the reconstruction of Council public assets to their original condition, SHEPHERD Inspectors have also proactively set out around 90% of the treatments for the September 2022 event.
- All four contractors have continued exceptional work in all four quadrants for the delivery of the September 2022 Event. The closing out of treatments is currently at 30% completion to date with contractors progressing well and on target with their prospective programs with an estimated completion date of the 30 April 2025.
- Tender evaluation meetings have progressed, and contracts will be awarded after this month's Council Meeting for Humeburn Road and Yerrel Road submissions.
- Schmidt Contracting in NWQ is currently working on Jandell and Blackgate Roads. Schmidt Plant Hire in the NEQ is currently working on Linden Nebine and Yarmouth Roads. Russell Grader Hire in the SWQ are currently working on Pitherty Road, while Tuckwell Transport & Earthmoving in the SEQ is currently working on Gamarren Road. Contractors are progressing well and are on target with their prospective programs.
- To assist Council to capture evidence of infrastructure damage during the September 2022 event as well as future activations of new events, SHEPHERD have provided a complimentary RACAS® (Road Asset Condition Assessment System) camera. RACAS® takes high resolution images every 10 metres as well as capturing precision GPS and roughness data of the road as it is driven. They worked very hard on the pre-challenge activities and on the day were amazing to watch working together to complete the 10 challenge activities. Each activity related to a fictitious event, but an event that they may come across in Council on any given day. I was very proud to have the opportunity to be their mentor and to see them work together while also learning so much about themselves and each other.

The team had to be fully self-sufficient, taking whatever they thought they may need to complete the challenge activities, whilst not knowing what that might be. The only thing provided was a work area and lunch. They needed to organise laptops, charging devices, flip charts, power boards, cords, stationery, and snacks (brain food). Some teams came with props or costumes for their introduction, whiteboards, trolleys to carry their gear, laminated signs, and fairy lights and lots of other interesting bits and pieces. As usual Paroo Shire Council was able to make do with less. Their workspace might not have been the prettiest, but the team did the job all the same and exceeded their own expectations and acquitted themselves admirably and took care of each other during the challenge.
