


LIBRARY UPDATE

The first meeting of the newly formed Rural Advisory Group was held on 16th January 2025 and resulted in some positive outcomes towards addressing the issues of main concern to rural residents.

INFRASTRUCTURE UPDATE

My name is Dave Burges and I'm here in Paroo Shire helping the Council on a range of issues and now am the Interim Director of Infrastructure with the recent departure of Kerry Jones. I have a long background in local government with over 32 years' experience in a range of roles including 13 years as a CEO (9 years as CEO of Quilpie Shire so I'm familiar with the Southwest) and 9 years as a Director of Engineering in Goondiwindi. I'm enjoying being back out in the West and helping councils like Paroo to provide critical services to the communities we serve, and I look forward to meeting many locals over the next little while.

Shire Road Crews

Crews are currently undertaking heavy shoulder maintenance on the Bollon Road and the Charleville Road. One of these crews will then start re-sheeting on the Bollon Charleville Road[DB1].

Shoulder grading has been done on the Eulo Toompine Road and when gravel is ready, widening of sections of this road will commence. Together with drainage works and culvert extensions, Council, in partnership with the Department of Transport and Main Roads, will be spending approximately \$2M on this road this financial year.

Reconstruction of Essential Public Assets (REPA) Flood Repair Works - Council has 4 flood events in progress as follows:

• Event 1 (January 2022)

All quarry and construction work are completed and the financial acquittal with the state government is approximately 95% complete.

• Event 2 (September 2022)

Works are progressing well with approximately 60% of the construction works completed. Local contractors are working in all four quadrants of the Shire.

Event 3 (January 2024)

4 separate submissions have been made to the state government, one for each of the 4 quadrants we divide the Shire into for delivery by contractors. The total estimated value of the submissions to date is \$10.2M.

When the scope of works is finalised tenders will be called for the winning and crushing of gravel and construction of the works.

• Event 4 (December 2024)

This event has been activated and lodged with QRA and a rapid assessment of the entire road network has been completed. The emergent work pick up has commenced in the NW Quadrant as this area was the most severely impacted.

A detailed damage assessment ahead of undertaking the emergent works has commenced, focusing on the NW Quadrant as a priority.

The emergent works are currently being scheduled and should be completed by March and the detailed damage assessment and submission lodgments are forecast to be completed by mid-year to allow restoration contracts to be prepared and awarded later this year.

Water Pipe Replacement Scheme

This project is well advanced and should be completed by March 2025. The reinstatement of the trenches across the town streets has commenced and more will be done soon.
