Message from the CEO

With all the recent wild weather the proposed SWROC deputation visit to Queensland parliament was postponed and will now be undertaken on 31st March and 1st April. Mayor Beresford and I will be attending on behalf of Paroo Shire Council, meeting with most Ministers to push for better outcomes for the SWROC region.



While the Ministerial deputation was rescheduled the LGAQ Civic Leaders Summit was still held. Some 100 delegates from across Qld attended the Summit including Mayor Beresford, Deputy Mayor Brain and I for professional development training. Sessions included Successful Advocacy, Councillors Obligations and Right to Information, Executive Well Being and Self-management, Strategies for Sustainable Organisational and Workforce Change.
