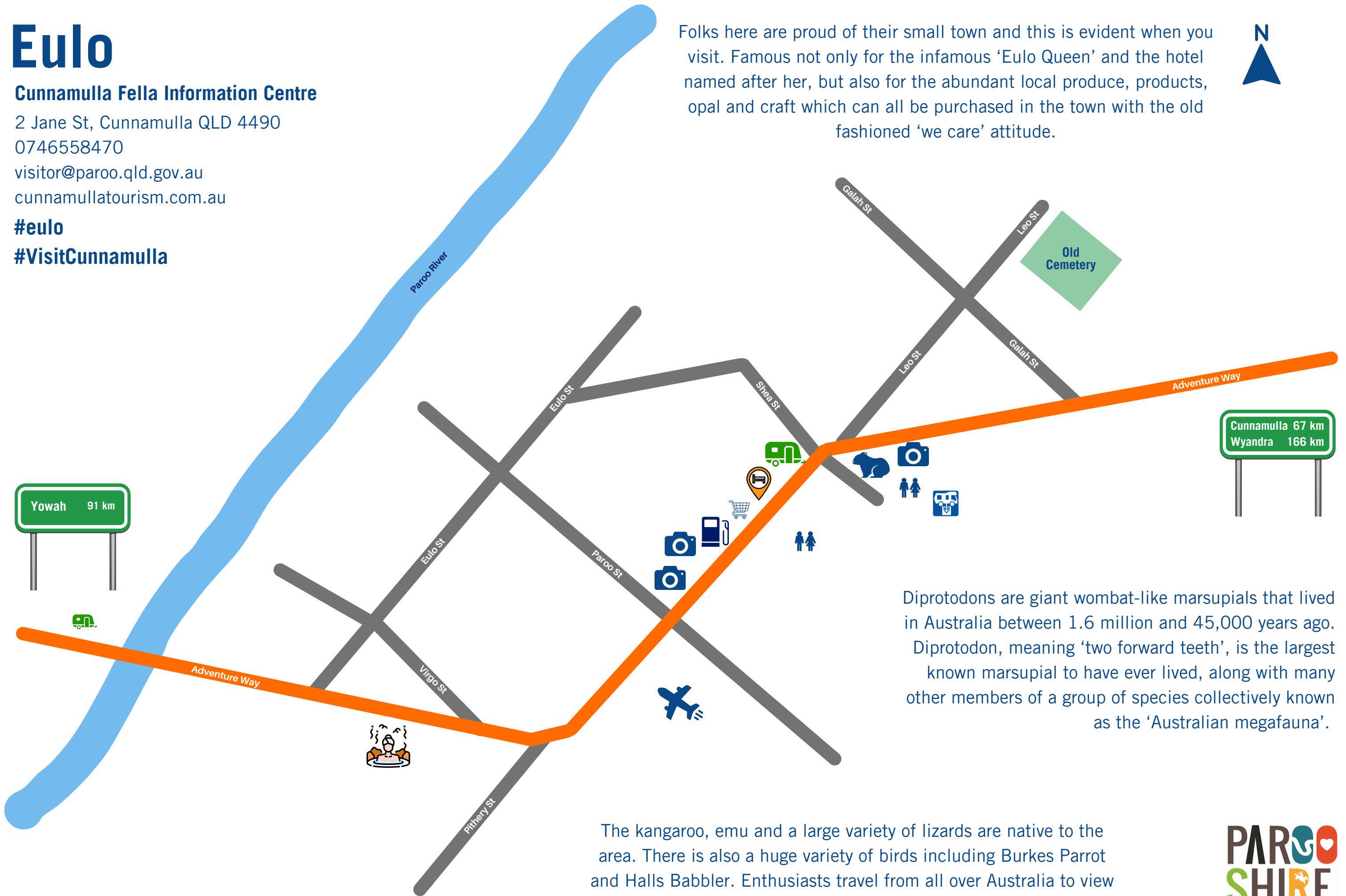

Diprotodonts are giant wombat-like marsupials that lived in Australia between 1.6 million and 45,000 years ago. Diprotodon, meaning 'two forward teeth', is the largest known marsupial to have ever lived, along with many other members of a group of species collectively known as the 'Australian megafauna'.

The kangaroo, emu and a large variety of lizards are native to the area. There is also a huge variety of birds including Burkes Parrot and Halls Babbler. Enthusiasts travel from all over Australia to view these birds.
